Forward Deployed and Forward Employed, the CALTRAP Division must be ready to "Fight Tonight!" Unit readiness cannot occur without the personal readiness of every Marine and Sailor. Fostering personal readiness requires a methodical approach to develop the mental, physical, legal, financial, and logistical independence of our personnel and their families.

Commanders train, equip, and man according to the needs of the mission. The same rigorous analysis must be applied to the Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Programs (UPFRP). Our UPFRPs will be focused on increasing overall personal and family readiness.

When the call comes to "Fight Tonight," will you be ready? Will your family? Will your Marines and Sailors? Although supported by the command team and a robust network of resources, personal readiness begins with the individual. All Marines must take the initiative to be ready. As the forward deployed Division, we must be most ready when our nation is least ready.
